 The meeting was Chaired by GW, the Monk Soham Parish Council Chairman, as required under local government legislation, who welcomed those present.

AVM05/23 - 04 Minutes of the Last Meeting (3rd May 2022)

AVM05/23 - 05 Chairman's Report

AVM05/23 - 06 Open Forum

GW opened the meeting to everyone present, resulting in the following salient points being discussed in relation to Hungers Green, viz:

- There was still an urgent and ongoing need to decide exactly what was needed in the short term and beyond. This included its funding and management. The Parish Council cannot simply rely on volunteer help or donations.
- GR said that he believed that a contractor from Ashfield had offered to cut and bail the grass for £1.75 a bale but didn't want to use it himself. However, two other parties had shown interest. It was agreed that the simplest way would be to put these parties in direct contact with the contractor in the first instance. GW was tasked to facilitate this asap.
- One longer term solution may be to let Hungers Green be "rewilded", with only the footpath cut to
 allow access. This would encourage more insects and wildlife. However, it was stated that they
 would be objections to this by some villagers. One suggestion was that this could be tried for a
 year and then opinion canvassed. However, it was thought that if this was tried and the decision
 then taken to revert to its current management plan, the extra expense would be high. In
 addition, "rewilding" still required a degree of ongoing management and the access tracks at both
 ends would still require attention.

GW concluded the meeting by thanking everyone for their contributions and the meeting closed at 20:55.
